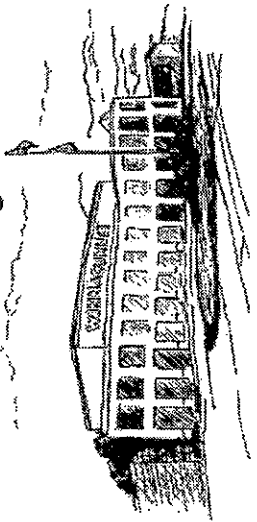


Winnacunnet Evening High School

HISET Prep Program

The HISET Prep Program offers students an alternative process for completing high school. The goal is to pass a test covering language arts/writing, reading, social studies, science, and mathematics. If interested, please contact your high school counselor. This option is for NH students only.

Student Responsibilities - Adult High School

According to the State of New Hampshire

Department of Education, Adult High School

Diploma Program Regulations require:

+Students must be enrolled in the Adult High School Program for at least one (1) semester in at least one (1) course before they are eligible to receive their adult diplomas
 +Each student shall successfully complete a minimum program of twenty (20) units for Graduation.

+Courses required for graduation are:

- English 4.0 units
- Mathematics 2.0 units
- Science 2.0 units
- Social Studies 1.0 unit
- U. S. History 1.0 unit
- Economics 0.5 unit
- Civics 0.5 unit
- Computer 0.5 unit
- PE/Wellness 0.5 unit
- Electives (8 units)*
- **Total 20.0 units**

* =work employment and community service can be counted towards electives. For more information, see the director

Registration Dates

Registration for first quarter begins the third week in August. Registrations are on-going throughout the school year. Please call (603)758-9224/ 9231 for an appointment.

Fees and tuition is dependent on student's residence and the purpose of taking the course. Registration fee is due at time of registration. Tuition must be paid in full before the first night of class.

All students under 18, with their parent/guardian, must meet with the adult high school director prior to enrollment.

Evening High School Opportunities

Diploma Program

Adult High School

- 20 credit NH Adult Education diploma
- Students 17 and older who have not completed high school
- Day students can transfer into the program instead of dropping out
- Strict attendance and participation agreements required
- Highly qualified teachers
- Career counseling/employment skills
- Formal graduation ceremony
- Tuition required for out of district students or students over 18
- Classes meet 1 to 3 evenings per week
- Application required

Credit Recovery

- Credit make-up for transfer into day program
- Students may be dual enrolled
- Strict attendance and participation agreements required
- Highly qualified teachers
- Option to transfer to Adult High School
- Tuition required for all credit recovery students (in some cases, financial aid may be available)
- Classes meet 1 to 3 evenings per week
- Application required

HISSET Prep program

- Any day or evening student, ages 16-18
- Day students can transfer into the program instead of dropping out
- Strict attendance and participation agreements required
- Open enrollment
- Team meeting and application required
- Must meet reading and credit guidelines
- Weekly instruction in HISSET exam preparation
- Classes meet 4 evenings per week
- Mandatory practice test required in all subjects
- Subject test mastery is required to take the 5 HISSET subject tests
- Highly qualified teachers
- Tuition free
- Successful HISSET exam completers receive a certificate, not a diploma

Course Offerings

The specific evenings for class meetings will depend upon the instructors and course enrollments. Notification of student schedules will take place after registration deadlines for each session. Classes will not run if there is insufficient enrollment.

English, Skill Building, College & Career Counseling, Math coursework, Science coursework, Economics, civics, Social Studies electives, Woodworking, Art, US History and Independent Study availability. **PLEASE REMEMBER** . All students must follow the state mandated guidelines regarding attendance and behavior. Completion of required class work is mandatory. The Director has full state and school district authority to disenroll any students who do not follow the rules and regulations.
